Course Description:

The Skyline high school Art Program is designed so that students will experiment with a variety of media to create visual art. Students will work with the elements of art (line, shape, space, color, value, texture, and form) are studied in three-dimensional. Students will begin to apply the principles of design, (rhythm, direction, balance, contrast, dominance, proportion, and harmony/unity) in their art making practices. Art is a form of visual communication; therefore, students will continually reflect their thoughts (both written and verbal) on their work, the work of other artists, cultural art traditions, and art history.
